I am referring Ms. Denham into your care for full assesment of her triple coronary bypass surgery on the 10th of May, 2012.

Ms. Denham is a primary school teacher with a recent history of insomnia, hypertension and a increasing chest tightness and breathlessness during the last three months. She had suffered a stressful divorce and she is raising 3 dependent children at the moment. Ms. Denham was admitted on 10 May, 2012 after a severe angina attack. The next day she was undergo the surgery.

Ms. Denham is transferred 48 hours later to ICU with severe chest pain. She commenced the protocol to prevent post-operative complications based on leg exercises combined with respiratory routines. Once in ward, she showed anxiety and a lack of encouragement and support for her recovery during the week that followed. On 25 May, 2012 she is independent for walking and the use of the Triflo became an incentive for her improvement. Now, her idea is being ready for start working in two months.
